

# Hook Infant School

## PE and School Sport Funding Action Plan 2015/16

London 2012 gave Britain a once in a lifetime opportunity to inspire a nation to enjoy sport and the government wants to embed that into the school day from an early age. The school sports funding aims to build on that legacy and improve the quality of provision in every state primary school in England. Schools can choose how they use the funding, for example to:

- hire specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with teachers during PE lessons
- support and involve least active children by running after school clubs i.e. Change4life clubs <http://www.nhs.uk/change4life/>
- purchase resources and run training courses for staff
- increase pupils sport participation

### Accountability

Ofsted expect schools to report on PE and sport provision and how the additional Government funding is spent.

Schools are required to publish on their website details of how they spend, or will spend their PE and Sport funding grant.

- Introduce new planning developed around the new curriculum
- Improve lunchtime play and the participation of all children
- To provide activities for children who don't like to take part in sports type activities.
- Contribute towards maintenance and quality outside play area.
- Professional development for P.E co-ordinator and include other staff.

PE Leadership time	£450  £600	To be able to plan and resource a Forest Schools initiative in order to improve the coverage of outdoor education in the PE curriculum.
